

The Teaching and Training Service Unit for Animal Production and Veterinary Medicine of the French Agricultural Research Centre for International Development (CIRAD) have announced their 2010 programme in “Capacity Building for Livestock Management”.

CIRAD offers the following training modules as part of its 2010 programme:

- Molecular diagnosis for the early detection of avian influenza A and Newcastle disease viruses, taught in both English and French (14 – 25 June 2010).
- Diagnosis of contagious bovine Pleuropneumonia (CBPP), offered in both English and French (15 – 19 November 2010).
- Bases in animal diseases epidemiology. Training is conducted in French via e-learning (2 January to 30 June 2010).
- Integrated Wildlife Management, offered in French (1 – 12 February 2010).
- Food safety and veterinary public health in the South, taught in French (11 – 22 October 2010)
- Methodology in Epidemiological surveillance. Training is offered in French (18 October – 19 November 2010).
- Pastoralism: societies and territories, conducted in French (8 – 19 November 2010)
- Tropical Aquaculture, offered in French (15 – 26 November 2010)
- Information systems in epidemiological surveillance, taught in French (22 November – 10 December 2010).
- GIS applied to epidemiological surveillance. Training is conducted in French (29 November – 10 December 2010).

Please Note: Some of the abovementioned programmes are offered in both English and French, while others are offered only in French, as indicated next to each programme listed.

The following 2nd year Masters diploma-oriented training programmes may be chosen from:

- Animal husbandry in the Mediterranean and the tropics (September 2010 – September 2011)
- Animal Husbandry in the South: environment and development (September 2010 – September 2011)
- Epidemiological surveillance of human and animal diseases (September 2010 – July 2011)
- Animal health and epidemiosurveillance in tropical regions (September 2010 – September 2011)

CIRAD is also offering a Certificate of Higher Studies (CES) in animal epidemiology. This programme will run from 13 September 2010 to 31 January 2011.

Please Note: All Masters diploma training programmes are conducted in French. Proficiency in the French language is thus assumed and required for enrolment in any of the programmes.
